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



The boost in net sales was equally noteworthy, reaching EGP 12.87 billion in January-September 2023 compared to EGP 9.48 billion in 9M-22, as revealed in the consolidated financial statements.



Missed Opportunity for Iran: Domotex Middle East Shifts from Tehran to Dubai

n a recent twist in the narrative of the Iranian carpet industry, Ali Farhi, a distinguished personality in machine carpet manufacturing and the head of the Kashan Machine Carpet Manufacturers Association, has expressed regret over a significant missed opportunity for Iran to establish the Middle East Domotex brand in Tehran. Despite the flourishing domestic market for hand-woven and machine-made carpets, Iranian companies have actively sought to bolster their global presence through participation in international exhibitions.

Iran, renowned for its rich heritage in crafting both hand-woven and machine-made carpets, supports millions of livelihoods within the industry. However, the market's competitiveness has escalated due to fierce competition among over 700 manufacturing companies armed with cutting-edge technology.

In response, Iranian companies have strategically directed their focus towards global exhibitions in the carpet and flooring industry. Many have secured exhibition spaces at Domotex events held in various countries, including Germany, China, Turkey, and others.

Recent years have witnessed heightened political tensions and visa issuance challenges for Turkish companies at the Domotex Hannover. In response, Turkish carpet manufacturing associations and companies boycotted the Domotex Hannover, organizing a



significant independent exhibition in Istanbul (CFE). Subsequently, Domotex decided to relocate from Turkey to Dubai, leading to the establishment of Domotex Middle East.

Ali Farhi, representing the Iranian machine-made carpet industry, disclosed the strenuous efforts made by the Kashan Association to persuade Domotex to host the Middle East event in Tehran. Unfortunately, the proposal faced rejection from the German company, citing insufficient infrastructure in Tehran and ongoing political tensions between Iran and Germany as primary obstacles.

Expressing disappointment, Ali Farhi highlighted Iran's robust production capabilities in carpets while underscoring the challenges posed by political and economic sanctions. He lamented that these sanctions significantly curtail Iran's machine-made carpet exports, potentially denying the country billions of dollars in revenue.

After weaving, securing the lower part of the carpet prevents tilting, followed by identifying the central thread, marking it distinctively to initiate the circular pattern. Precise marking of the design on studs with concentric circles ensures accuracy in weaving.

Iran Eases Rules for Exporting Persian Hand-Woven **Carpets to Boost Revenues**

n a significant move to revitalize its struggling carpet export industry and generate much-needed hard currency, Iran has announced the relaxation of rules governing the export of its world-renowned hand-woven carpets. The decision comes as the country seeks to rebound from the economic challenges posed by years of international sanctions.

Farahnaz Rafe', the head of Iran National Carpet Center (INCC), revealed this groundbreaking development, emphasizing the government's commitment to encourage and facilitate the export of these high-quality Persian rugs. A primary change announced by Rafe' is the removal of a long-standing requirement for carpet exporters to funnel their export proceeds into a system where importers could access hard currency at subsidized rates.

The policy alteration is expected to reinvigorate Iran's carpet industry, which has in Europe and other parts of the world, faced significant obstacles due to stringent export regulations. Exporters, under the previous system, were required to surrender their hard-earned foreign currency earnings, a process that had deterred many over the years and caused a sharp decline in carpet shipments.

Rafe' confirmed that the Iranian Ministry of Finance has already granted approval for this measure, and she assured that positive developments are on the horizon.

Iran's carpet industry has been grappling with challenges that have taken a toll on its exports. According to data from the Iranian customs office, carpet exports hit a record low of just \$50 million in the future. calendar year ending in late March. This figure is significantly lower than the \$700 million milestone achieved in 2018, just been celebrated for their exceptional sures.



before the United States imposed sanctions on Iran.

However, Rafe' pointed out that official customs statistics do not provide a comprehensive picture of Iranian carpet exports. Many exporters employ re-export strategies to deliver their carpets to clients circumventing the banking and trade restrictions imposed by U.S. sanctions.

Unofficial estimates suggest that Iran exported carpets worth between \$400-500 million in the calendar year ending in late March. These figures indicate that revenues have rebounded to levels last seen in 2015, shortly after Iran emerged from a previous bout of international sanctions.

Rafe' expressed optimism regarding the prospects of this policy change. By easing the rules governing the export of Iranian hand-woven carpets, the government aims to rekindle the sector and foster an increase in carpet shipments in the near


