

200,000 Rare Handcrafted Silk and Wool Carpets Worth Around Dh2b on Show at Carpet and Art Oasis



Speaking further about his Dh5 million carpet, Dr Ghanbarinia said: "This particular carpet captures the rich designs and art of Persia. There are more than 800 colours in it and 2,500-year-old art," he ex-

plained.

"The first week of the event attracted more than 5,000 visitors while 300 carpet items worth more than Dh5 million were sold during this period," he told reporters.

A close look at the carpet shows the type of flowers used. "Some are fictional flowers from the Safavid Empire and another flower, for example, represents a symbol of life and goes back to 1,500 years."

Delicately woven, the base is the part that contains the gold and the silk is the work that comes on top, so when stepped on, the gold remains untouched, Dr Ghanbarinia said.

years of history and 4.2 kilograms of gold has been holding the spotlight at this year's Carpet and Art Oasis, one of Dubai Shopping Festival's (DSF) main attractions for the last 22 years.

Once rolled out on the floor of the exhibition, the Dh5-million handmade carpet, made of pure silk and gold, will make you think twice before stepping on it.

"It took seven-and-a-half years for six men to make it. If one person worked on it alone, it would have taken a lifetime," said Dr Afshin Ghanbarinia, vice-chairman of Heritage Carpet who produced the 6×10-metre rug.

The three-dimensional masterpiece, roughly the size of a squash court, is one among 200,000 rare handcrafted silk and wool carpets, worth around Dh2 billion featured at the exhibition organised by Dubai Customs.

Ahmad Mahboob Musabih, director of

Persian carpet carrying 2,500 Dubai Customs, toured the event site and said that the Oasis has played a major role in adding colours to DSF, attracting more visitors and promoting Dubai as a major trade and tourism hub.





"For these types of carpets, customers go for their beauty and luxury, but also because it's like a work of art on a canvas. The difference though is that with a painting, a mistake can be cleaned up, but with rugs, a mistake in a single knot will ruin the entire piece. This is how complex it is," said the carpet expert.

Dr Ghanbarinia said his carpets, mostly produced in Iran, "are like diamonds" and have the same demand by people of all nationalities.

Abdul Rahman Eisa, chairman of the Carpet Oasis' organising committee, said like every year, the 22nd edition features a plethora of rare carpets brought from the world's most famous carpet manufacturing countries.

"More than 70 per cent of the handmade carpets here are made of pure silk. Some carpets have taken more than 15 years to complete. We have made sure there is something for everyone. The prices of the carpets range from Dh2,000 to Dh5 million," said Eisa.

Some of the unique rugs only for display this year is a 400-year-old rug and a 150-year-old rug worth \$14 million — both from Iran.

"One carpet from Kashan, a village in Iran, shines more as more people walk over it," he said.

Spanish design brand Nanimarquina has released a collection of rugs informed by plastic beads in collaboration with German artist Sabine Finkenauer.

Made from hand-tufted 100 per cent virgin wool, rugs in the Pearls collection come in a range of sizes, formats and colourways, yet they share a common design thread – they are made up of round forms reminiscent of beads.



The collection's circular area rugs represent single beads and come in two-tone colourways – beige combined with green, black or an orange-red hue – and are suitable for larger spaces.

Runner rugs are also available in two-, threeor six-circle-long formats that mimic strings of beads – and are designed for long, narrow spaces such as hallways.

The brand envisages the rugs to be used either in isolation or grouped into playful clusters.

The continuous evolution of the Chinese real estate industry, coupled with the growing emphasis on aesthetic considerations, is anticipated to further propel the Moreover, China's ceramic floor output remains robust, with ceramic tiles dominating the market landscape. The surge in residential construction activities is anand outdoor wall coverings, further bolstering the ceramic tile segment.


China boasts a notably high output of ceramic flooring, directly correlated with the expansion of the construction sector. The surge in demand for ceramic tiles, propelled by escalating residential construction endeavors, extends to both indoor and outdoor wall coverings. With a burgeoning population, the construction sector is poised for further growth, thereby amplifying the demand for ceramic

tiles. Notably, the Chinese market predominantly comprises low-cost ceramic tiles, consolidating ceramic flooring's dominance among various flooring types. In 2021 alone, China's production exceeded eight billion square meters of ceramic tiles, solidifying its position as the world's foremost ceramic tile producer.

Export activities also play a pivotal role in shaping the dynamics of the Chinese floor covering market. China's status as the world's largest exporter, coupled with its position as the top trading nation, underscores its pivotal role in the global trade landscape. The influx of international companies into China's flooring market attests to the nation's allure as a lucrative investment destination.

The competitive landscape of the Chinese floor covering market is characterized by the presence of major players such as Milliken Flooring, Forbo Flooring Systems, Hanflor, BeFlooring, and Hanse Tile. These players are increasingly focusing on innovation, channel expansion, and marketing strategies to enhance their market share and capitalize on emerging opportunities.

Recent developments, such as Milliken & Company's strategic investment in Orak for sustainability initiatives, underscore the industry's commitment to environmental responsibility. Additionally, regu-






latory measures, such as the Indian Commerce Ministry's recommendation for anti-dumping duties on vinyl tiles from China and Taiwan, reflect efforts to safeguard domestic players from unfair trade practices.

The future outlook for the Chinese floor covering market remains promising, buoyed by evolving consumer preferences, urbanization trends, and technological advancements. A comprehensive analysis of market dynamics, emerging trends, and segmental insights underscores the immense growth potential and opportunities inherent in China's vibrant floor covering market.

China Carpet Market

The Carpets & Rugs market in China recorded a remarkable revenue of US\$4.55 billion in 2024, showcasing its robust

growth potential. With a projected annual growth rate of 10.08% (CAGR 2024-2028), the Chinese market demonstrates promising prospects for further expansion.

Despite being surpassed by the United States, which led the global market with a revenue of US\$17.79 billion in 2024, China's per capita income in the carpet industry reached US\$3.18, highlighting its significant contribution on a per capita basis. This dominance is attributed to China's rich cultural heritage and the exceptional craftsmanship exhibited in its carpet and rug production, solidifying its position as a key player in the global market.





Still indestructible after all these years

n 1997, the British Crown Colony of Hong Kong was returned to China, the world mourned Princess Diana and the people of Germany were brought together by the flooding of the River Oder. In the same year, the BG Klinikum Unfallkrankenhaus Berlin (ukb) opened in the Marzahn district of Berlin.

What started with 400 employees is now a renowned healthcare campus that employs 2000 people on the Blumberger Damm. The ukb has 25 faculties and departments, its own admissions ward, 26 wards and over 730 beds. It functions as a tertiary care trauma centre and also offers secondary care for districts in the east of Berlin.

The A&E is one of Germany's most modern and handles 60,000 patients every year. In a tertiary care hospital the interior and the floor coverings in particular must of course meet the highest standards. Those responsible therefore decided on rubber flooring back in 1997.


There are almost 12,000 m2 of norament and noraplan throughout the entire hospital. These multifaceted, indestructible, German-made floorings are easy to clean and economical to maintain. Their high quality and wear-resistance means that they also last for many decades and so fulfil sustainability criteria.

Flooring that stands up to heavy loads and footfall

As a medical facility of the German Statutory Accident Insurance Association (DGUV), the hospital treats people after accidents at work and people who require medical treatment as a result of an occupational disease. A tailored therapy concept is developed for each insured person.

The hospital also has a centre for physical therapy and rehabilitation, a research centre, a centre for emergency training and its own rehabilitation clinic on site. These buildings also have rubber flooring. Torsten Gundlack, Head of Construction at the Construction and Technology Department, has worked at the ukb since 2010.

"After all these years with nora rubber flooring, we are still extremely satisfied, particularly with regard to their immaculate appearance and favourable life cycle costs", he says. Like his predecessors, he has chosen rubber flooring for all the construction and renova-



tion projects at the ukb. "Nothing can stop this robust flooring", says Gundlack. "Not the constant bed traffic, not the never-ending movement of equipment and not the huge number of patient feet, crutches and wheelchairs."

Easy to clean and economical to maintain

Gundlack is also very happy with how easy it is to maintain nora flooring. "The fact that we do not need to coat the flooring simplifies work for the cleaning staff and saves us effort in terms of organisation", he says.

The surface of the nora flooring is so thick that it does not ever require coating, deep cleaning or re-sealing. This is a huge advantage for areas such as A&E, which must always remain open and cannot be closed for cleaning.

both norament and noraplan. This is a critical team. benefit because maintaining floor coverings (cleaning, regular recoating and refurbishment costs) can place a heavy burden on hospital budgets. The product with the cheapest initial purchase price is not always the most economical solution in the long term. Purchase price alone usually only accounts for just under ten percent of a floor's total life cycle costs and experience shows that maintenance accounts for over 90 percent. Service life therefore often proves to be the main cost driver and rubber flooring offers a clear advantage such cases.

Decades of durability: a sustainable solu-

The service life of nora rubber floors is above average: norament floors last for 50 years and noraplan floors last for 30 years. "nora floorings are high-quality, extremely robust and last for decades", says Gundlack.

The decision-makers at ukb chose a sustainable solution back in 1997 — a time when the word "sustainable" was not yet on everyone's lips. The ecological advantages are obvious. Floors that last longer do not have to be replaced so quickly and this reduces the cost of new purchases. Less waste is produced and less raw materials and energy are required to produce new floor coverings. This constitutes an important contribution to resource conservation and the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions.
